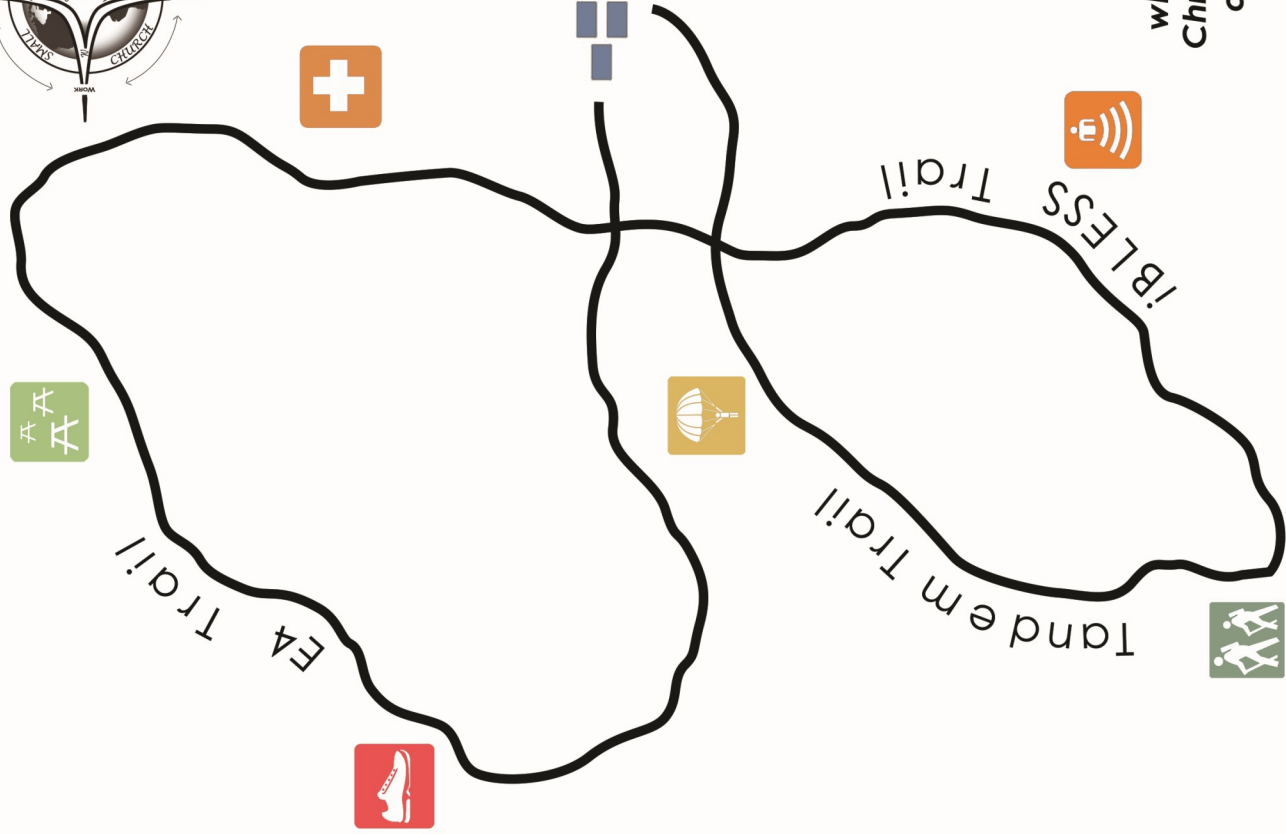

REQUIRED FOR ANYONE WHO WISHES TO SERVE WITH KIDS OR YOUTH

United Methodist Temple is a "Safe Sanctuary" congregation. The Temple leadership has worked in conjunction with all program areas to make sure our ministries with children and youth, on campus and on trips, offer a safe environment that truly enables the peace of Christ in the safe-care of children.

We have established and instituted policies that include screening and checking references for all paid employees and all volunteers. Our paid staff is trained to recognize signs of abuse and is required by state law to report incidents of abuse that they discover. All of our ministries now include minimum standards for adult supervision and watch-care for children and youth. Our nurseries have staff members who are trained in infant care and attention. We have developed and are instituting building alteration and usage policies which ensure that children and youth are in visible areas, including having glass panes installed in doors and making sure that our leaders keep all activities in fully visible areas.
